



4 Mull Types | Assembly Options

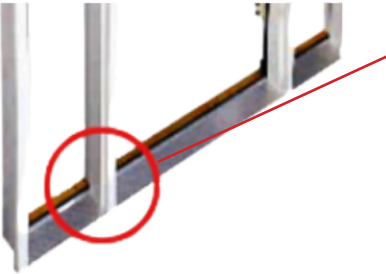
Narrow Mull

Narrow mullions are most commonly used in the new construction application. This option uses 1" mull posts to assemble the unit on a continuous head and sill. This option does not offer spread flexibility since the mull posts are only available in one width. Additionally, a storm door adapter kit will need to be used if a storm door is requested.



Exact-Size Back-to-Back

This jamb option is our most versatile frame assembly that offers a one-piece head and sill. It is built with two 1.5" pieces at the mull, so material can be put between them, offering more flexibility in the spread (up to 4"). Additionally, since it is made with the same jamb depth as the perimeter jamb, it is finished storm door ready.



Fat Boy Mull

Built from a larger mullion, the Fat Boy Mull option does not offer the ability to spread. However, it is a stronger build using 1.5" mull posts on a continuous head and sill and is storm door ready.

Boxed Unit

A Boxed Unit is essentially three frames mullied together using three sills and three heads. Although this assembly type is not widely used, it offers an infinite spread and the unit can be mullied on-site. Boxed units are also storm door ready.
